Ed Miliband and Ed Balls' three point plan for £326 billion of *more* spending, *more* borrowing, and *more* debt could put up a family's mortgage interest bill by £5,000 per year.



he Conservatives have published a new dossier setting out the detail of Labour's three point plan for £326 billion of more spending, more borrowing and more debt that could put up a family's mortgage interest bill by £5,000 per year.

Ed Miliband and Ed Balls' spending rules say that all their frontbenchers are capable of making spending commitments.

Since they set out these rules, the total net effect of Labour's frontbench statements which change the Government's current tax and spending plans would:

- Increase borrowing and debt by £326 billion over the next five years compared to the Government's plans;
- Only reduce the deficit by a quarter over four years - not halve it over four years as Ed Balls has promised; and consequently it could
- Put up the average family's mortgage interest bill by £5,000 per year.
